I have attended a Meeting with Governor Minner and numerous meetings with other state agency officials, DVFA Safer R&R Project. five w/DEMA in regards to IMT Training and NIMS, three CFSI, two DHSTPWG, two SFPC meeting, two DVFA Officer's meetings, 800 MHz meeting, four Homeland Security Meetings, three DEMSOC Committee Meetings, SERC meeting, two Del Dot TMC meeting, viewing of LADVFA PP Charlotte Bush, and a meeting with the new DVFA Public Relations Consultant David
